ACTIVITY PACK









Sticky tape or stapler

You can use any sized paper you like

Unfold your paper and stick or staple the top and bottom edges together to make a tube. (See picture in the sticker.)

Now you can make your handle – use the strip of paper from the beginning and stick each end to either side of the top of your lantern so that it loops over.



All you need is:

Some colourful paper (any colours you like)
Some scissors (ask a big person to help if you need it)

Some glue or sticky tape

Cut out some long strips of the paper, all the same size. Then stick the ends of one of your paper strips together to make a circle. With a second strip of paper, feed it through the paper circle and then glue its ends together to make a second circle. Your two circles should be linked together. Keep going like this for all of your strips of paper until you have one long beautiful, colourful, amazing chain!



All you need is:

Some card
Some long, colourful wool
Some scissors (get a big person if you need help)

From your piece of card, draw and cut out 2 circles. They need to have a smaller hole cut out of the middle...think of a ring doughnut. You can make these any size you like, the bigger the frame, the bigger the pompom!

(Just make sure they are the same size as each other) When you have your circles, put them together and then start to wrap your wool around both of them, round the outside and through the middle of the hole.

When you have lots and lots of layers (the more layers, the fluffier the pompom!) then take your scissors and cut around the edge of the wool, in between the two circles. You need to tie a piece of string inbetween the two circles to secure it. Slide the cards off and you have a pom pom!









Making a Den

You will need:

(The back of a sofa, or some good chairs – even the side of your bed can work) A large blanket (or a collection of smaller blankets) – thinner ones are best

How to do it:


• First, arrange your furniture (make sure you will have room to fit inside)

- Next, throw your blanket(s) over the top to create your
- Then attach it all together you can use the clothes pegs or tie the blanket corners.
- Fill it with comfy things Now it's perfect for enjoying stories, snacks and adventures.

Easy Peasy Version: Find a table in your house and then drape a large blanket over the edge to make a door (make sure the table is clear first!)

You can even decorate your new den with some of your pompoms, paperchains and lanterns








You will need:

2 cups of plain flour
1 cup of salt
1 cup of warm water
A mixing bowl
An oven
(ask a big person for help)



How to do it:

Pre-heat the oven to 120 C In a large bowl mix the water and salt, until the salt has disappeared

Add the flour, bit by bit, until you have a soft dough Roll out, cut out whatever shapes you like, draw patterns in.

Don't forget to add holes if you want to hang them! Bake until dried out completely (1-2 hours)

You can paint your decorations for added colour.

Hang them up and enjoy!
